Brookewood was founded in 2006. The school's first senior class graduated in May 2010. There are 145 students total; 72 in grades 1-8 and 73 in grades 9-12. There are 19 students in the class of 2020.

Brookewood is approved to operate an elementary and secondary school by the Maryland Department of Education. Brookewood has 16 full-time, 11 part-time faculty members.

- Three years of Language: Latin and/or Italian (3 credits)
- Four years of Religion (4 credits)
- Five Credits of Electives (5 credits)

Grading Scale

There are two semesters with end of term exams in January and June. Grades are scored: A 90-100, B 80-89, C 70-79, D 60-69, F 0-59. GPA is calculated:



Brookewood had 20 students take a total of 35 exams in May of 2019. Of the 35 tests, students scored a 3 or higher on 22 of the exams.
